

<u>Iowa Veterinary Technician Application by Work Experience in Jurisdictions</u> <u>Without Licensure Requirements</u>

An applicant for initial registration who has relocated to lowa from another jurisdiction that did not require a professional license/registration to practice in the profession may be considered to have met any educational and training requirements if the person has at least three years of work experience with a substantially similar scope of practice to the profession for which registration in lowa is sought. The three years of work experience must be within the four years preceding the date of application for initial registration. The applicant must satisfy all other requirements, including passing any required examinations, to receive a license.

Instructions: Complete the application and include the following:

- Application fee of \$25.00
 - We currently do not accept online payments. Please submit check or money order payable to the Iowa Board of Veterinary Medicine
 - o Fees must accompany submitted application
- Copy of diploma (to be no larger than 8 ½ inches by 11 inches) or an official transcript from school sent to the lowa Board of Veterinary Medicine (address below)
- Proof of passing both the veterinary technician national examination and lowa's veterinary technician state examination
- Proof of Iowa residency, which may include:
 - 1. Residential mortgage, lease, or rental agreement;
 - 2. Utility bill;
 - 3. Bank statement;
 - **4.** Pay check or pay stub;
 - **5.** Property tax statement;
 - 6. A document issued by the federal or state government; or
 - 7. Any other board-approved document that reliably confirms lowa residency.
- Proof of three or more years of work experience within the four years preceding the application for registration, which may include:
 - 1. A letter from the applicant's prior employer documenting the dates of employment;
 - 2. Pay checks or pay stubs;
 - 3. If self-employed, business documents filed with the secretary of state; or
 - 4. Any other board-approved evidence of sufficient work experience.
- Proof that the work experience was in a practice with a substantially similar scope of practice to the type of registration sought in Iowa, which must include:
 - 1.A written statement by the applicant detailing the scope of practice; and
 - 2. Business or marketing materials detailing the services provided.



- Proof that a professional license/registration was not required in the other state, which may include:
 - 1. Copies of applicable laws;
 - 2. Materials from a website operated by a governmental entity; or
 - 3. Materials from a national professional association.

Incomplete or mutilated applications will not be accepted.

Beginning January 1, 2021, you may be eligible to apply for a fee waiver if you meet the following requirements. This fee waiver will only affect the license/registration fee and does not apply to renewals. :

- 1) An applicant for initial licensure is eligible for a waiver of initial licensing fees if the applicant's household income does not exceed 200% of the federal poverty income guidelines and the applicant is applying for a license/registration for the first time.
- 2) To determine eligibility, you must first identify the number of individuals in your <u>household</u>. Once this is determined, reference the <u>Federal Poverty Level</u> and identify the income that matches the number of individuals in your household. If your household income, as reported on your most recent federal tax return, is less than the identified value, you are eligible for the one-time fee waiver.
