Introduction:

1. Emalyn Polz, Division of Soil Conservation and Water Quality (Division) opened the meeting with introductions:
 - Tanner Puls, with the Division
 - Emalyn Polz, with the Division
 - Jeremy Bril, with the Division
 - Staff and Coordinators, with Heartland Coop
 - Engineer(s), with ISG
2. These Batch and Build Edge-of-Field projects are being used to help implement the Iowa Nutrient Reduction Strategy.
3. **Heartland Middle Iowa 25-26 Batch (EOF 2026-01):**
 - There are 18 saturated buffers to be constructed for this project. Per the Batch and Build process, all 18 saturated buffers will be bid under the Heartland Middle Iowa 25-26 Batch and Build Edge-of-Field Project.
4. **Heartland Lower Cedar 24-26 Batch (EOF 2026-02):**
 - There are 20 edge-of-field practices that will be constructed within this project. 17 saturated buffer and 3 bioreactors sites will be bid under the Heartland Lower Cedar 25-26 Batch and Build Edge-of-Field Project.
5. The Heartland Middle Iowa and Lower Cedar 25-26 batches will be bid separately, but the bidding information discussed today will apply to both projects.
6. Please review all documents and let us know if you have any questions.

****The following statements apply to both the Heartland Middle Iowa and Lower Cedar 25-26 Batches****

Bidder's Qualifications:

All Bidders shall meet the following qualifications:

1. Contractors are required to be registered with the Department of Inspections, Appeals & Licensing.
2. New site for vendors working with the state of Iowa: <https://das.iowa.gov/how-do-business-state-iowa/procurement>
3. Bidders shall, upon request of the Division, submit a statement of Bidder's Qualifications including experience, any contracts that are in default, available equipment, personnel, and financial ability to perform the work as outlined in Section 2 of Document BB.

Method of Bidding:

This is a **unit price contract**, and bidders shall submit unit price bids as required for the work items covered by the specifications. Prices shall cover complete work and include all costs incidental thereto unless otherwise indicated. The base bid includes all items needed to construct the project. A quantities list was provided in today's handouts, as it contains all the items stated in Document CC. The same quantities can be found in the 'Items' section of this project's IMPACS post.

Any questions that should be considered as part of an addendum must be submitted to us by **3:00 pm, on April 30, 2026**. The Division will make every attempt to issue any necessary addenda no later than the day after the last date for questions. **If an addendum is sent, please make sure to note on IMPACS (in 'Questions') that you have received and acknowledged the addendum.**

If work is added to the contract by the Division after the contract execution which is not covered by a bid price set forth in the Proposal and Schedule of Prices (Document CC), a Change Order or Contract Amendment will be issued as required. If the additional work requires an extension of the contract completion date(s), a Contract Amendment will be issued.

Submission of Bids and Bid Security:

Bids and all bid-related documents should be submitted on the Iowa Procurement and Contract Management System (IMPACS). Pages 1-3 of the Proposal and Schedule of Prices (Document CC) must be signed by a legally authorized representative of the Bidder and notarized- then submitted as a file under the 'Vendor Attachments' section of this project's IMPACS post. All issued addendums shall be acknowledged as received by the Bidder. Do not submit Plans or Specifications with the bid. If these items are not submitted correctly, this shall prevent the reading of that Bidder's bid.

Bid Security must be in the minimum amount of ten percent (10%) of the total base bid amount and submitted in one of two ways:

1. Surety Bond upload to the appropriate project's IMPACS post. Please download and utilize the Bid Bond form (Document EE) which can be found in the 'Vendor Attachments' section of the IMPACS post.
2. A Certified Check or Cashier's Check may be used but must be delivered to IDALS. Bidders choosing this option must upload a statement in IMPACS indicating their intent to submit a certified or cashier's check, which must be physically delivered to IDALS at least three hours before the bid deadline.

SEALED bids are due no later than 3:00 PM via IMPACS on **May 6, 2026**. Bids received after this time will be rejected and returned unopened to the Bidder. Bids will be opened beginning

at 3:00 PM on that same day on a Microsoft Teams Call-in number: +1 469-998-7627, code: 529421284#. Note that the Heartland Middle Iowa 25-26 (EOF 2026-01) and Heartland Lower Cedar 25-26 (EOF 2026-02) projects close on IMPACS at the same time. EOF 2026-02 will be read first, then the EOF 2026-01 bid will follow directly after.

Evaluation of Bids and Award of Construction Contract:

This Batch and Build Edge-of-Field Project shall be awarded to the **lowest responsible responsive bidder as determined by the Division**. In evaluating the bids, the Division may consider such factors as alternates, bid price, experience, contracts in default, responsibility of the Bidder, and similar factors in determining which bid it deems to be in the best interest of the Division for the project. In comparing bid prices, the total bids of the various Bidders shall be determined by applying the unit prices bid for each work item against the estimated work item quantities set forth in the Proposal and Schedule of Prices (Document CC). Bid tabulations for this Batch and Build Edge-of-Field Project will be prepared and distributed to all Bidders. Other plan holders or interested parties must request bid tabulations.

Execution of Contract:

1. The party to whom this Batch and Build Edge-of-Field Project is awarded shall be required to:
 - ✓ submit a statement of Bidder's Qualifications before a Notice-of-Award will be issued,
 - ✓ execute the Contract,
 - ✓ obtain the appropriate insurance coverage and Performance/Payment Bond,
 - ✓ provide their Iowa Division of Labor Public Registration Number,
 - ✓ and submit the Construction Progress Schedule (Document JJ)within fourteen (14) calendar days from the date of receipt of the Notice-of-Award. In case of failure of the Bidder to execute the Contract, the Division may, at its option, consider the Bidder in default, in which case the bid security accompanying the bid shall become the property of the Division.
2. The Division, within fourteen (14) days of receipt of an acceptable and properly executed Performance/Payment Bond, certification of acceptable insurance coverage, and properly executed Contract; shall sign the Contract and return to such party an executed copy of the Contract. Should the Division not execute the Contract within such period, the Contractor may, by submitting written notice, withdraw the signed Contract. Such notice of withdrawal shall be effective upon receipt of the notice.
3. The Notice-to-Proceed shall be issued within five (5) days of the execution of the Contract by the Division, provided that the Construction Progress Schedule has been accepted by the Division. Should there be additional time required to make adjustments to the Construction Progress Schedule, the time to issue the Notice-to-Proceed may be extended to allow for this. If the Notice-to-Proceed has not been issued within a thirty (30) day period, or within a greater period mutually agreed upon,

the Contractor may terminate the Contract without further liability on the part of either party.

Taxes:

Since this is state contract, there is no sales tax for materials purchased. We will be providing a tax exemption certificate to the awarded contractor as indicated on the last page of the appendix of construction contract documents. This should be considered when determining the unit prices submitted in the bid.

Measurement and Payment:

The specifications describing the work to be accomplished under each particular work item also describe the method to be used in measuring and calculating the payment quantities for each work item set forth in the proposal. Payments will be made on the basis of monthly estimates in amounts equal to ninety-seven percent (97%) of the value of work completed. Mobilization will be paid at a percentage of the lump sum bid amount for this item equal to the overall percent complete of the project (less retainage). In preparing monthly estimates, advancement will be made therein for ninety-seven percent (97%) of the cost of materials stored on site.

Time of Completion:

The final date for completion of all work except for seeding is set for June 1, 2027. The final date for completion of seeding is June 1, 2027.

There are liquidated damages provisions on this project. This damage reflects additional administrative, design, and inspection costs, as well as continued costs to the natural environment. If all work except for seeding is not completed by June 1, 2027, absent a No-Fault Extension, the Contractor may be assessed damages in the amount of \$175 per day. If the seeding is not subsequently completed by June 1, 2027, absent a No-Fault Extension, the Contractor may be assessed damages in the amount of \$125 per day.

Questions and Addenda:

Any oral interpretations given shall be valid only if confirmed by written addendum. All interpretation requests should be addressed in writing and received no later than 3:00 pm, on April 30, 2026. The Division reserves the right to revise or amend the Contract Documents prior to the date set forth for receipt of bids. Such revisions and amendments, if any, shall be announced by an addendum or addenda to the Contract Documents. Copies of such addenda, as may be issued, shall be furnished to all plan holders.

Pre-Bid Meeting General Discussion:

- Ruth from Heartland Co-Op gave a brief overview of the batches and their involvement in them.
- Emalyn talked through the bidding process and how to register for IMPACS
- Jeremy covered the specification documents and went through the individual plans to discuss any relevant items
- Ruth clarified that their team probed tile depths during survey.
- Discussion included why some portions for the distribution line transition to non-perf in low-lying areas.
- **ADDENDUM WILL BE SENT for the Heartland Lower Cedar 25-26 Project (EOF 2026-02).** Site 34 currently has the pasture mix listed. It does not require that mix; instead, it will need the cool season mix and the native mix.
- For bioreactors (or any project), any excess soil needs to be hauled out of the 100-year floodplain.
- If crop damage occurs, the price for the damage will need to be determined with the landowner. The contractor will be responsible for paying the cost for damage directly to the landowner, but the contractor will be reimbursed.
- Sole proprietors must have workman's compensation insurance.

Q&A

- Q.** What counties are involved?
- A.** For the Heartland Middle Iowa Batch, the counties are Marshall, Poweshiek, and Tama. For the Heartland Lower Cedar Batch, the project area is Cedar and Muscatine Counties.
- Q.** Is there a cutoff for fall seeding?
- A.** Yes, please see seeding specifications in both Construction Specification documents.
- Q.** Is frost seeding allowed for Natives?
- A.** Yes, please see seeding specifications in both Construction Specification documents.
- Q.** What fence is required to be replaced?
- A.** The sites that require fence replacement are outlined in the plans. Construction Specification IA-382 outlines what type of fencing is suitable for replacement.
- Q.** What type of rock is needed for the project, and where does it need to be placed?
- A.** Please bid the appropriate type and size of rock as outlined in each bid items sheet. If your supplier does not have 1.5 inch, please use 2 inch.
- Q.** How much prep work will be required for seeding new buffer area?
- A.** The contractor would be required to prep and seed the converted crop ground.
- Q.** Do all sites have anti-seep collars?
- A.** Each plan outlines the need for anti-seep collars, if included.
- Q.** If trenching in the distribution line, are you required to strip topsoil?
- A.** No.
- Q.** If we intercept an additional tile when installing the distribution line, do we tie it in, or install non-perf on the existing tile?"
- A.** It depends on the site. Regardless of the situation, contact us before proceeding.
- Q.** What is required for the contractor when installing a WCS that will have monitoring equipment (Site 15a in the Heartland Middle Iowa Project)?
- A.** ISU will handle the installation of the monitoring equipment; the contractor just needs to install the WCS.
- Q.** Is the CMP sleeve going to be required for sites being grazed?
- A.** Yes, this is required.
- Q.** Is the rock under the CMP sleeve incidental?
- A.** Yes.
- Q.** Is there an address for physical checks?
- A.** Yes, 1305 E. Walnut Street, Des Moines, IA 50319. Physical checks as part of the bid bond must be delivered by 12 pm on May 6th.
- Q.** Site 32 in the Heartland Lower Cedar Batch will be a part of IDALS's 'Summer Tour' on June 16th, what should the contractor be aware of regarding this event?
- A.** The Summer Tour is a way for conservation and agriculture professionals to learn more about agricultural projects throughout the state. This year, the summer tour will include a 'Batch and Build Feature', which will showcase the selected contractor's installation of Site 32. We would appreciate having active construction for this event

on June 16th. A more defined plan will be established at the pre-construction conference with the selected contractor.

Q. What is included within the 'Site Preparation' bid item?

A. The construction specification packet for both projects provides a great explanation on what is to be included as site preparation (CS IA-01). Site Preparation includes, but is not limited to: vegetation removal, brush removal, fence removal, and topsoil movement.

This project includes 18 saturated buffer structures located in Poweshiek, Tama, and Marshall County, Iowa. The estimated cost range for this project is \$155,000 to \$185,000. Some of the materials required for this project include: water control structures (WCS), perforated and non-perforated piping, outlet structures, amidst other items. In general, the work involves, and is not limited to, earthwork, grading, mobilization, and seeding.

A pre-bid conference will be held at 10:00 AM, on April 23, 2026 at the Belle Plaine Community Library, 904 12th Street, Belle Plaine, IA 52208. Attendance at the pre-bid conference by prospective bidders is not mandatory but is encouraged.
