Meeting convened @ 9:03 AM

- Welcome and Introductions made by Secretary Northey
  - Public comments will be received at end of meeting
  - o Call for additional agenda items made, none noted.
- Iowa Nutrient Reduction Strategy Update
  - IDALS Updates
    - Recent Fall 2013 HTF meeting was summarized
    - 12 states, 5 federal agencies and tribes comprise HTF
    - States focused on completing nutrient strategies by end of 2013, beginning of 2014
    - Joint meeting with CenUSA Bioenergy meeting
    - Tied to water quality by use of perennials
    - Spring HTF meeting in 2014 planned for Arkansas
    - HTF released reassessment document recognizing progress and challenges
    - No new number or date for achieving zone size reduction, but recognition that
      2015 goal will not be met
    - Summary of progress on statewide practice funding given
    - Tremendous response seen to availability of funds
    - Priority watershed demo projects will be coming this fall
  - DNR Update
    - 4 permits issued to date, 6 on public notice
    - No permits have been appealed
    - Strong support from EPA
  - ISU update
    - Lang Grant University (LGU) group met concurrently with HTF meeting
    - Working on how to engage with states on WQ efforts specific to nutrients and hypoxia
    - Developing MOU between LGUs and HTF to formalize partnership

- NRCS Soil Health/Water Quality Initiatives Update
  - Compliance workload requirements limit other assistance
  - Partnerships critical for support
  - EQIP cover crops showing dramatic increases from 4060 acres in 2009 to 88,929 acres in 2013
  - National and State CIG grants are available
  - o Q Are there established standard soil health indices?
  - o A WRCC partners have expertise, but no specific defined list exists
  - WRCC provides opportunity to focus leadership on this topic
- SRF Sponsored Projects Update
  - IFA and DNR joint program
  - Combining point and nonpoint source projects together
  - Has funded \$148M in nonpoint source projects since 2003
  - Not a grant program, rather a method of adjusting the amount borrowed and interest rate on loans
  - October 14 EPC meeting to approve intended use plan
  - 23 applications received requesting \$13M

    - Requested WRCC representative at WPAC meetings. Want more opportunities to report to WRCC.

    - Continue support for MRBI as major catalyst.
    - Sales/marketing needed beyond just information/outreach/education efforts
    - Emphasis on motivating action
    - Sales training for MRBI coordinators needed. Could approach private sector for support.
    - REACH program from MS State a great model
    - Put producers out front to sell practices. Farmers are used to being sold on things.

    - Science assessment lacks info to assess streambank load issue, need a strategy for addressing this.
    - Partnering with DNR on floodplain mapping.
    - CIG activities on floodplain outreach/education program. Work with IFC on tool training
    - INHF providing match for grad student

- Looking to identify most vulnerable areas for scour erosion and areas in most need of permanent vegetation.
- Organizing several meetings with local groups and partners
- Hope to have efforts up and running w/n 3-6 months of maps completion

- Documentation needed to show progress. NRI has metrics.

## Karen Flournoy

- Urban stormwater is a source of nutrients and a good opportunity to address with SRF.
- EPA science advisory board last week put out a paper on waters of the US. Out on comment until November 6<sup>th</sup>. Public meeting will be held in Washington DC.
- Draft rulemaking has been sent to OMB for interagency review followed by posting for public comment in the federal register eventually.
