Tuesday, February 28, 2017 Meeting Notes

Welcome & Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 1:31 PM. A sign-in sheet showing attendees is attached to the meeting notes.

WRCC Member Agency Updates

<u>HSEMD (Bartlett)</u>- Working through recovery components of 2016 flooding in eastern lowa and HUD lowa Watershed Approach.

<u>ISU (Lawrence)</u>- Soil Health Conference was held in February with 350 attendees. Farmer meetings and cover crop seminars are ongoing. IA Nutrient Research Center has legislative event and collaborators meeting on March 9.

NRS Annual Measures reporting is coming up. ISU staff will begin working to collect information for this year's report this spring.

<u>UNI (Clayton)-</u> Getting ready for field season. Working with new faculty member on UAVs and ways to measure environmental quality.

<u>DNR (Schneiders)-</u> Working with CDI on Source Water Protection Initiative in seven water sources in the state. Also provided an update on point source permitting program status. Feasibility studies are coming in and in a couple of cases permittees are looking at installing nutrient removal equipment in their plans.

<u>IEDA (Geerts)-</u> IEDA is working to announce CDBG awards for storm water. Projects can now be funded quarterly for water/sewer, or on an open cycle for stormwater management when paired with SRF or IDALS funding. In December, the state of Iowa completed a comprehensive energy plan under leadership of Lt. Governor Reynolds. Part of the study focused on a connection between energy production and water quality, specifically dealing with biomass production. A task force is being organized to develop this component of the energy plan.

<u>IDALS (Gillespie/Hansen)</u>- Water Quality Initiative- The initial round of 8 targeted demonstration projects has begun their second phase, with projects continuing for 1-3 more years and expanding demonstration efforts. The next round of five projects is in the process of developing plans for its second phase as well. Statewide closed with \$3.8 Million currently obligated. Estimated over 850 first time users and 1000 prior users for cover crops. Cover crops are being applied and bills are coming in final numbers and survey results will be available this spring.

IDALS continues to work directly on two RCPP projects leveraging resources in targeted demonstration projects, and we are supporting initiatives in the Middle Cedar, Upper Cedar, and Fox River watersheds.

The Omaha District of the US Army Corps of Engineers is currently accepting comments on a draft EIS pertaining to management of the Missouri River Ecosystem for creation of shallow water habitat in order to meet Endangered Species Act requirements. IDALS is reviewing the Draft EIS along with other

members of the State Interagency Missouri River Authority and will submit comments to the Authority and if necessary to the Corps prior to the April 22 cutoff for those requests. We are also monitoring issues related to water supply rulemaking and potential changes to the Federal Flood Risk Management Standard and the impacts of those proposals on agriculture in our state.

IDALS and DOT staff met in January to continue to discuss wetland programs and partnership potential as it relates to DOT's mitigation needs and opportunities to achieve water quality benefits in the process. So far we have outlined an agreement to communicate potential site information and if an opportunity to collaborate either on funding or project design arises we will consider that.

IDALS and DNR are working with EPA and USACE staff to explore the potential for a new regional permit that would expand our ability to install nutrient removal wetlands in the state. The permit would be similar to Regional Permit 34 which covers the CREP program, only in this case we would look to address projects that do not have federal funding involved or are not in the areas covered by the CREP initiative. Also working with NRCS to partner on delivery of engineering services for wetlands and edge-of field practices and hoping to finalize an agreement soon.

Northey asked ISU to consider presenting in the future on the process for adding suitable practices/processes to the Nutrient Reduction Strategy.

<u>IDOT (Nicholson)-</u> Working to pair with IDALS on wetland mitigation/water quality. Looking at other ways to partner on projects if possible, including design assistance/project review. AAHSTO annual meeting will be in Des Moines in July. The environmental committee will meet and will do some tours of Living History Farms to showcase some stream mitigation efforts on the property.

<u>IDPH (Schmitz)</u>-Working with partners to hold a water quality workshop in conjunction with Governor's public health conference. Details will follow from Iowa Public Health Association.

<u>IIHR (Schilling)</u>—In process of deploying nitrate sensors. New sensors going in to Rock and Floyd River basins. Also monitoring some practices for water quality treatment efficiency. Installing some phosphorus sensors in Cedar Rapids and in two other watersheds. The hope is to be able to better predict phosphorus loads in Iowa. Working with INRC to publish a paper on nutrient removal tied to oxbow restoration. Will likely pursue inclusion of the practice in the NRS.

NRCS (Adkins)- Six active RCPP projects going in lowa right now. NRCS is interested in working with DOT to look at road structures and ways to partner on projects that protect infrastructure and improve soil conservation. Discussed Conservation Learning Labs project in partnership with lowa Learning Farms. Conservation Collaboration Grants deadline is now March 31st. Next round of RCPP pre-proposals due April 21st. \$252 million available nationally.

<u>NWS (Fowle)</u>- Reported that February is the warmest on record in Des Moines, surpassing record in 1933. Precipitation has been near normal for February but at 30% of normal for the winter south of Highway 20. March outlook has no strong signals for temperature or precipitation.

Long-range forecasts indicate that temperatures will be above normal for the spring, and precipitation may be slightly above normal. Flood risk will be normal in the north and below normal in the rest of the state. The next spring flood outlook will be released on March 2.

Harmful Algal Blooms in Iowa

Stu Schmitz, IDPH State Toxicologist gave a presentation on the agency's annual report on harmful algal blooms (HABs) and also public advisories/beach closures. A copy of the presentation can be found on the WRCC website.

Question on what level that the blue-green algae becomes visible. Schmitz will look at WHO report and follow-up. Discussion also followed on studies looking at weather as a predictor of events.

Schneiders mentioned DNR proposal to develop a HAB predictor that was not invited for full proposal. EPA has microcystin standards out for public comment. Looking at standards for swimming and water consumption. Comment period runs through March 20.

WQI Demonstration Grant Process Assessment

Jim Gulliford, Soil and Water Conservation Society, gave a presentation on assessment work being completed by SWCS on the Water Quality Initiative demonstration projects. A copy of the presentation can be found on the WRCC website.

Comment on sustainable funding and partnerships- Need to ask companies participating for direct funding for projects.

Flood Risk Management Working Group Update

Aimee Bartlett, State Hazard Mitigation Officer, HSEMD, gave a presentation on Disaster Recovery and Hazard Mitigation, focusing on avoided damages documented during Fall 2016 flooding as a result of hazard mitigation projects since the 2008 flooding on the Cedar River. WPAC Update and Presentation of Annual Report

Clare Lindahl, CDI, is the WPAC chair. She presented the 2016 WPAC Annual Report to the Council, highlighting areas of agreement and plans for 2017. The WPAC is scheduled to meet again in April.

HUD Iowa Watershed Approach Update

Keith Schilling, IIHR, provided an update on the HUD Iowa Watershed Approach project. Quarterly WMA meetings are still ongoing and some coordinators are being hired, while others are adding staff. Western Iowa WMAs are still in the organizational phase but will get going in the Spring. Additionally the Watershed planning process is being organized in the WMAs.

Public Comments and Adjournment

There were no requests from the public to address the Council.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:00 PM. The next meeting will be held in late spring, location and date to be determined.
